Borough-Based Jails Program


- The City is closing its outdated jails and seeking to create buildings that are equal in ambition to the transformational changes that have taken place and continue to unfold in the City's criminal justice system.
- These projects must be a beacon of quality civic architecture, supportive of immediate neighborhood context and of all New Yorkers.
- Seeking high-quality, innovative and transformative designs
- This procurement is **NOT** a low-bid procurement



Overall Program Scope of Work

Smaller, Safer, Fairer system by 2026 that will have:

- Housing for a total of 3,300 people (requires 3,545 beds)
 - Tailored housing for medical, behavioral and mental health needs
 - Stable re-entry into the community
- Four borough-based sites, 886 beds per site
 - 1. Queens:
 - o Parking Garage
 - o Dismantle / Swing Space
 - Facility with male and female persons in detention
 - 2. Brooklyn:
 - o Dismantle / Swing Space
 - Facility with male persons in detention
 - 3. Manhattan:
 - Facility, Swing Space, Dismantle with male persons in detention
 - 4. The Bronx:
 - Facility, Dismantle with male persons in detention











In addition to the City's goal for enduring design that supports justice reform for many decades to come, the City is seeking teams with the capability to deliver high-rise facilities in dense, urban environments, to optimize energy-efficiency and sustainability, to provide robust minority- and women-owned business enterprise participation, to deliver design excellence in the community-specific urban realm, and to reduce construction and operations-related community impacts.

Evaluation. Proposers are evaluated on overall design philosophy with respect to the BBJ and identifying opportunities to achieve Project Excellence in design, construction and project delivery.

PASSPort: Procurement and Sourcing Solutions Portal

Procurement and Sourcing Solutions Portal (PASSPort) Disclosure Filing (formerly known as Vendor Information Exchange System (VENDEX) Forms or Certificate of No Change)

All organizations intending to do business with the City of New York should complete an online disclosure process to be considered for a contract. This disclosure process was formerly completed using Vendor Information Exchange System (VENDEX) paper-based forms. In anticipation of awards, proposers must create an online account in the new Procurement and Sourcing Solutions Portal (PASSPort) and file all disclosure information.

Paper submissions, including certifications of no changes to existing VENDEX packages will not be accepted in lieu of complete online filings.

Minority/Women-Owned Business Enterprises

The Department of Design and Construction is committed to creating an equitable and competitive business environment while ensuring the agency's procurement reflects the diversity of New York city.

New M/WBE Program Developed for BBJ Focused on Partnering and Delivering Results.

- BBJ must comply with the "**objectives and goals**" of Section 6-129 of the Admin. Code of the City of New York.



Minority/Women-Owned Business Enterprises

Major Differences:

- Proposers will be credited for M/WBEs certified by either NYC or NYS.
- Proposers may be credited for City- or State-certified M/WBEs at any tier and for certified M/WBE suppliers.
- Proposers may be credited for City- or State-certified M/WBE participation within the prime joint venture.
- Evaluating M/WBE participation and approach will be one of the evaluating criteria for proposals.
- The RFQ sets forth a <u>Draft</u> Goal of 30% on design and 30% on construction.
- Collaborative/Partnering process to be used to set a Final Goal during the RFP phase.
- The City and awarded design-builder will both exercise good faith efforts to meet the Final Goal.

Request for Qualification (RFQ)

- Intent: Provide project information to Proposers to assist in the formation of the most highly qualified Design-Build Teams.
- **Result:** DDC will shortlist up to three (3) most highly qualified DB Teams for each Facility that exhibit the capability, capacity and past performance necessary to complete each applicable Detention Facility.



Statement of Qualification (SOQ)

• Intent: Respond to the RFQ, by allowing proposers to submit an SOQ addressing each pass/fail and quality evaluation factors.





Vendor Enrollment

To Enroll visit: <u>nyc.gov/passport</u>

Enrollment Process:

- 1) Account Creation (login information)
 This provides the login information to access PASSPort
- 2) Enter Basic Company Information
 - Gross Revenue, Contact Information, Owners, Officers, Business Address
- 3) Fill out Vendor & Principal Questionnaires
- 4) Identify Related Entities
 - Parent, Controlling, Affiliates, Subsidiaries
- 5) Certificate of Incorporation for New York State
 - Or equivalent document
- 6) e-Signature
 - Once this step is completed, the profile and questionnaires will be submitted to NYC Mayor's Office of Contract Services for review.
 - Once the signature is added, you must click the "Submit Package" button for the package.

All steps must be completed in order for MOCS to review the questionnaire and finalize enrollment.

A vendor is not enrolled until MOCS approval of the application is received.
